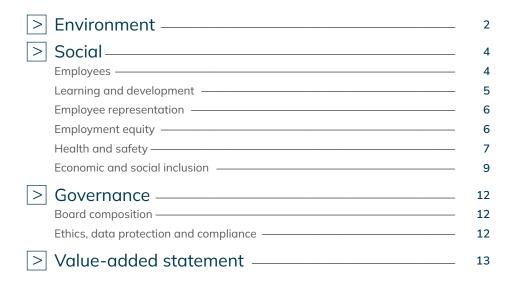




### Contents



The Motus indicator report contains the key metrics we measure as part of assessing our environmental, social and governance (ESG) performance. The content of this report supports our disclosure in the Motus integrated report, ESG report and Climate management approach. The 2025 metrics are reported for the period 1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025.

While we aim to report Group metrics, there are instances where metrics have different boundaries. This is clearly noted in the tables that follow. Differences are either due to an issue being material to a certain operation but less so for the Group as a whole, or because the maturity of our data collection and measurement varies between our operations. Examples include metrics related to broad-based black economic empowerment (B-BBEE), which pertain to our South African operation only.

#### **Carbon footprint information**

Our carbon footprint is calculated using the Greenhouse Gas Protocol Corporate Accounting and Reporting Standard (Revised Edition) operational control approach (all facilities where we have full authority to implement operating policies). Our carbon footprint covers South Africa (SA), the United Kingdom (UK), Australia, South East Asia and Southern and East Africa. The bulk of our operations are in SA with a growing footprint in the UK. We operate 767 sites globally, owning 204. Of our owned and leased sites, 84% and 58% are located in SA, respectively. The Polish and Milton Keynes (UK) distribution points will be included in our carbon footprint from 2026.
